A Look Back

Founded in December 2022, we created the Cherry Bekaert Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization, with the initial desire to give back to the communities where we live and serve. The Foundation collaborates and supports organizations that align with Cherry Bekaert's shared values, contributes impactful resources, and inspires and connects individuals to engage with their communities .

In June 2023, the Cherry Bekaert Foundation was publicly launched, with an initial \$1M pledge from the Cherry Bekaert partners to support our Foundation and the

charitable causes deemed most important to our people. After the Foundation's initial launch, Cherry Bekaert and the Cherry Bekaert Foundation teamed together to promote a reinvigorated Volunteer Program.

In March 2024, the Foundation announced its first national partnership with Junior Achievement (JA). This partnership allows Cherry Bekaert to impact the lives and education of youth around the country.

In March 2024, Cherry Bekaert Foundation proudly announced our first national partnership with Junior Achievement, committing an initial \$100,000 donation. The foundation is focused on connecting employees to volunteer opportunities in each of our markets as we continue to build on this exciting opportunity.

Junior Achievement USA is the nation's largest organization dedicated to giving young people the knowledge and skills they need to own their economic success, plan for their future, and make smart academic and economic choices. Their work in the areas of work readiness, entrepreneurship and financial literacy aligns with the Foundation's focus area of education.

The partnership offers year-round opportunities for employees of Cherry Bekaert to volunteer with Junior Achievement in the community and schools to educate children on life skills and financial literacy.

In December 2024, the Foundation board, based on the recommendation from our National Impact Committee, re-affirmed our commitment and partnership with JA by approving another \$100,000 donation in 2025.

Hurricane Relief

In the Fall of 2024, the East Coast was hit with two major Hurricanes: Helene, affecting the Carolinas and many surrounding areas, and one week later, Hurricane Milton affected significant portions of Florida. The Foundation quickly put together a fund-raising campaign asking Cherry Bekaert partners and associates to donate to support hurricane relief with an offer for the Foundation to match all donated funds. In 48 hours time, our partners and associates donated \$28,000 in relief contributions. With these proceeds and matching funds from the Foundation of \$44,000, we disbursed \$72,000 in grants earmarked specifically for Hurricane Helene and Milton relief among our impacted CB markets, to include The Salvation Army, American Red Cross, DirectRelief and Feeding Florida.

Grants Awarded

In addition to promoting volunteerism, the Cherry Bekaert Foundation is committed to supporting organizations that align with our focus areas through monetary donations. Our successful Volunteer Weeks and Community IMPACT grant program resulted in the Foundation awarding \$151,600 and \$32,000
